

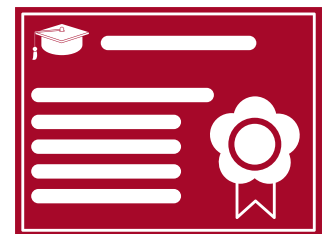
I EMPOWER SCHOLARSHIP

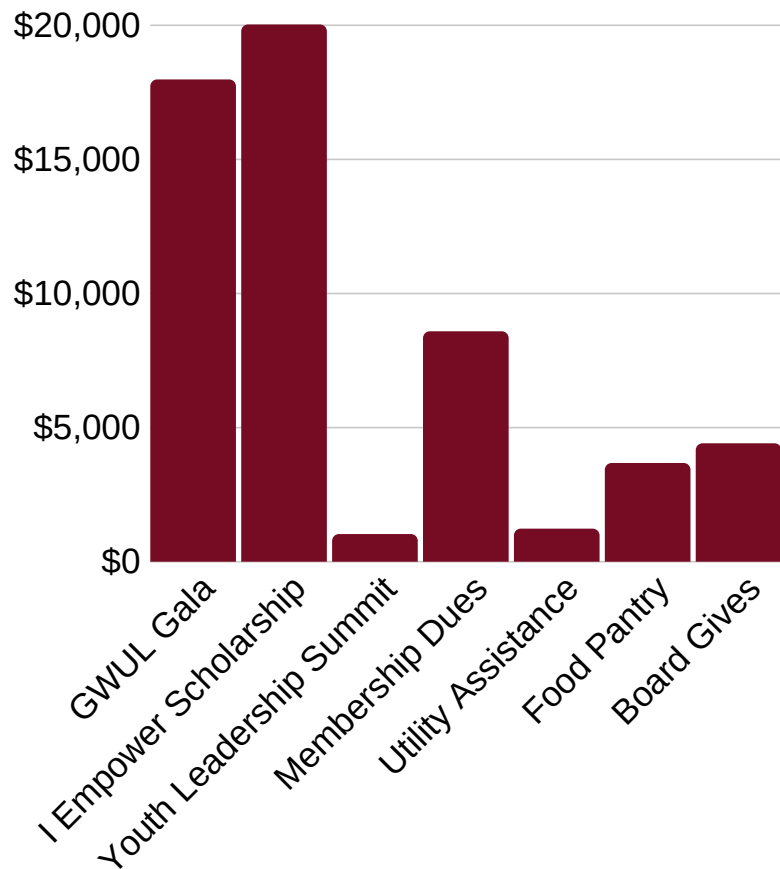
