

Taking Fund Development to the next level.

In 2019-2020 Thursday Network unlocked new partners and pathways to bring in more funds than we did the year before, for a total of \$110,354.59 to develop and maintain our outstanding programming, support the affiliate, and give back to the community.

New Partners

This term we've engaged a total of seven corporate sponsors, six of which were brand new or reinvigorated relationships, for a total of \$54,150 in corporate donations, a 60% increase from the previous year (\$33,675). Monumental Sports Sponsorship (\$50,000), Avalon Bay (\$2500), Edelman (\$400), Bens Chilli Bowl (\$500), Kyle Sterling Properties (\$250), Joseph Kitchen Family (\$250), Jazmine Karess Events (\$250).

New Pathways

This term we also established the Grant Writing Subcommittee and have so far built it up to 10 people who have met a total of 5 times and have applied for a total of 4 grants with a potential of \$32,500 in funding. Another new venture this term is the Thursday Network online merchandise store with 14 products available for purchase.

Individual Donations

Beyond corporate donations, we continue to engage individual donors who make Thursday Network a part of their annual giving. Since May 21, 2019 we've had 275 individuals donate a total of \$37,546, a 37.5% increase in number of donors, and a 30% increase in donation amount from the previous year.

Many individual donations were the result of creative fundraising events and campaigns. Our Giving Tuesday campaign led to \$3,405 in donations. Black Love Matters, our Valentine's Day Fundraiser + Join Week social brought in nearly \$500 in profit from Candy Gram sales. Spirit of Service, Thursday Network's end of year celebration and fundraiser, brought in \$3,450.







